



In accordance with the Convention on International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES), the Wildlife Protection Law of the People's Republic of China, the Regulations of the People's Republic of China on the Administration of the Import and Export of Endangered Wild Fauna and Flora, and other applicable laws and regulations, exhibitors are hereby reminded of the following requirements regarding the import and exhibition of endangered wild fauna, flora and their products at the 9th China International Import Expo (CIIE):

1. Import Requirements

To import endangered wild fauna, flora, or their products listed in the CITES Appendices, exhibitors must obtain a Wild Fauna and Flora Import and Export Certificate in advance. Any such species or products lacking a valid certificate are strictly prohibited from entering the territory of China via trade, personal carriage, or postal delivery.

2. Exhibition and Display Requirements

The display, sale, or promotion of products derived from endangered terrestrial or aquatic wildlife—including python, lizard, or crocodile skin products, sturgeon-derived cosmetics, and red coral products—is subject to prior approval by competent authorities. Exhibitors must secure one of the following permits in advance:

- Approval Document for the Sale, Purchase, and Use of Wildlife under National Key Protection and Their Products.
- Permit for the Commercial Utilization of Aquatic Wild Animals.
- Official Identification Card.

The import and exhibition of the following terrestrial wildlife and their products are strictly prohibited: ivory from extant elephant species and ivory products, rhino horns, and tigers, as well as any derived products.
